



# Principal's Newsletter

Dear Parents & Guardians,

We are living in a time which poses many challenges which tend to stir up our emotions. We tend to say things we would not ordinarily say. We need to remain focused on our vision for stakeholders to unite so our children can become successful citizens of tomorrow. My focus is to be able to offer the best for your children's benefit. I would like to remind parents of our achievements this past year. For the Prep school in 2020, we achieved a 100% pass rate based on units and a 97.5% pass rate based on subjects. For the College we had a 95% pass rate at AL, a 90% pass rate at AS and a 79% pass rate at IGCSE. This makes us comparable to the top schools in the country. We offered online lessons so that students would not lose out in terms of what they needed to cover for their respective ages, unlike what happened in many government schools. Currently, I have a dedicated staff which I am proud of. Hillcrest is a great school of choice that offers competitive education, sports and culture comparable to any other top school in the country. I am proud to be associated with Hillcrest and want it to do even better. As an ATS school and the top school in Manicaland (in my opinion) we need to strive to constantly improve. Times are tough but we really do need to invest in our future.

#### 1. Fees

We had a meeting with the SDC (4 members for the College and 2 members for the Prep school), Finance and Board Management representatives together with the School management to address issues with the budget ahead of the voting process. The **consensus opinion at the end of the meeting with regards to the Fee for Term 1** was:

 We reduce the Fee originally asked for Term 1 by spreading the difference between Term 2 and Term 3. The annual revised budget would remain the same.
 We originally asked for:

- This takes cognisance of the CBA and its resulting effects. It increased NEC wages by 229%, backdated to February and is USD based at the auction rate.
- It takes into account 6 months of learning and the holidays.
