I recently became partially deaf for several hours, nothing serious, but it did get me thinking; with the temporary loss of hearing, I suddenly did not trust myself. I had to take more care when walking as I could not hear traffic or people. I distrusted my eyesight to be the sole judge of what is going on around me, my whole body in a sense was affected and the body's effectiveness was diminished. It drove home a lesson that we all have a part to play, especially with regards to our children's education and if one part is affected the whole system struggles. We all need to play our part to ensure a better future for our children.

I have been remiss in informing parents of a significant event in Hillcrest Schools. Mr. Joshua Mutangadura will be leaving us at the end of his contract period at the end of August 2021 having arrived at Hillcrest in October 2011. During his time here he focused on improving all facets of the Prep School, particularly the academics. Hillcrest Prep successfully hosted the Interprovincial Owen Davies Rugby Festival and a Hockey Festival under his guidance. During his tenure the Prep School opened the ECD A and ECD B making Hillcrest a one stop institution for one's total educational needs.
